



Saint of the Week -



Biography St. Alphonsus Liguori, (1696-1787) was born in Marianella, near Naples, in Italy. When he was young, he displayed exceptional intelligence and piety, earning a doctorate in civil and canon law by the age of 16. Feeling a calling to dedicate his life to God and the service of others, however, he abandoned his legal career and pursued ordination to the priesthood. He was ordained at the age of 30 in 1726.

Throughout his priestly ministry, Liguori focused on preaching missions and retreats, seeking to renew people's faith and draw them closer to the Eucharist. He frequently preached on the real presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament and encouraged frequent reception of Holy Communion as a source of spiritual nourishment and grace. In 1732, Liguori founded the Redemptorists, a religious congregation dedicated to promoting devotion to the Eucharist and the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Redemptor-

ists' charism also revolved around reaching out to the most abandoned, including the

poor and marginalized, and offering them hope through God's love and mercy.

As a prolific writer, Liguori authored numerous works on moral theology, spirituality, and Eucharistic devotion. His most famous work, "The Glories of Mary," remains a classic in Marian theology and devotion. He is remembered for his practical and merciful counsel, always seeking to lead souls to reconciliation, and union with God.

St. Alphonsus was canonized as a saint in 1839 and declared a Doctor of the Church in 1871. His spiritual writings, particularly on the Eucharist, continue to inspire and guide the faithful worldwide. As the patron saint of moral theologians, his example reminds believers of the profound love and presence of Christ in the Eucharist and the enduring mercy of God. St. Alphonsus Liguori, pray for us!

ABSTINENCE – Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on **all the Fridays of Lent.**

FAST - Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday**.

On the days of Fast and Abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal.

Eating between meals is NOT permitted, but liquids (including milk and fruit juices) are allowed.

To disregard completely the law of Fast and Abstinence is seriously sinful!

Pastoral Reflections

5th Sunday of Lent

My dear parishioners,

God is Good!!! All the time!!! And all the time!!! God is Good!!!

In the first reading, prophet Jeremiah was quite familiar with the hardships of speaking up for God. His book is filled with personal reflections on the suffering he endured as a spokesman for the truth. But in this reading, Jeremiah looks ahead to a brighter future.

Greeks are now coming to inquire after Jesus. The world attracted to Jesus is expanding beyond the Jews and is now including the gentiles. It is fitting that the first two Jewish disciples, Philip and Andrew, are instrumental in the calling of the first gentile disciples. All this provides Jesus an opportunity to reflect on the arrival of his hour and the meaning of his death.

The hour has come. Jesus declares that his hour has come. This hour is when the Son of Man is to be glorified. Jesus unfolds the meaning of glorification through a saying about a grain of wheat needing to die before it produces much fruit. Glorification, therefore, refers to Jesus' death which will produce much life in the community of faith. It is necessary for Jesus to lose his earthly life in order to bring about the reality of eternal life. This is a pattern not only for Jesus but also for the disciples of Jesus. As Jesus goes, so go his disciples.

The urgency of the hour. Jesus declares that he is concerned about the hour but not because he fears it. Everything now hinges on the coming of this hour. This is what Jesus has been moving toward since his ministry began. This moment is urgent because of all that it brings with it. So, unlike the synoptic Gospels where Jesus seems to want to be preserved from this moment, in John's Gospel Jesus embraces it fully. It is the purpose for which he came.

A voice came from heaven. Jesus earnestly prays for the Father to glorify his name. Immediately, a divine voice is heard which brings together the past, present, and future self-revelation of God in Jesus. This, of course, leads to a misunderstanding on the part of the people who also heard the voice. Some thought it was thunder while others connected it with an angel. Jesus indicated that the voice was intended for the sake of the people. This is the time of judgment which the people will bring about depending on whether or not they accept and believe God's self-revelation in the person of Jesus. All of this will be accomplished when Jesus is lifted up on the cross which will bring about at the very same time his death and his glorification, the ultimate fulfillment of his hour.

Bless the Congress. Instill in them knowledge and understanding to enact laws that protect the sanctity of life - from the unborn to the elderly; and promote the good of all people.


Bless the people of the United States. Make us aware of our responsibility as citizens to uphold the principles of life, liberty, justice, and equality.
